TEEN DREAM ROOM ONE SHEET

Teen Dream Room is a thirty minute renovation show that witnesses the transformation of a teenager's bland, cluttered bedroom into a unique living space. The show will be hosted by two people, preferably an adult male and female who have some experience in art and design. The hosts will serve primarily as narrators who navigate viewers through various scenes of the episode; however, they should also be involved in the action by putting their art and design skills to use during some of the episodes.

The beginning of each episode will showcase problems with the teen's room. This will be followed by an interview in which the hosts will determine how the teen and the parents want to change the room. Meanwhile, a checklist of must-haves will be displayed on-screen. After the interview, the hosts will present two design ideas to the teen and the parents - the first option being cheaper than the latter. After the presentation, the parents and the teen will decide which design is best for their budget.

The middle of the episode will show the work being done to the room by the Team Dream Room Project Team which will include the building and renovation crew, the hosts, and occasionally family members. The hosts will keep the action moving forward by interviewing various members of the team and showing the progress that they have made. They will also discuss setbacks that may arise. At the end of the segment, the hosts will begin to reveal some of the finalized portions of the project prior to the official reveal.

At the end of the episode, the hosts will reveal the transformed space to their clients. The viewing audience will see glimpses of the room before the updates and after them. The viewing audience will also witness the parents' and the teen's reactions to the updates. Finally, the hosts will briefly recap some major highlights of the renovation and conclude the episode.

DESCRIPTION OF SHOW GUESTS

Show guests should be teenagers, between the ages of 13-17, that want to have their bedroom renovated. Teens must live with a parent or guardian in a home that is owned. The room to be renovated can be an individual teen's room or a room that is shared. Parents must be included on the show.

Target Location: Teen's parents' home

Episodic Breakdown: Episodes will vary according to the teen's wants and the parents' permissions. Below is a list of possible episode themes.

Act 1

The show opens with the hosts introducing the family to be helped for the week. The teen will share how they feel about the room and other family members will also comment. After the brief introduction to the problems with the room, the hosts will introduce themselves and the show will officially begin. The hosts enter the teen's home and the official interviews will begin with the family. The teen will discuss what they would like to have done to their room and the parents will add to this list of must-haves which will appear on the screen. Based on the complaints the hosts will present two ideas as options, one more expensive than the other. The parents and the teen will decide on the best option.

Act 2

The renovation team will begin working on projects. The hosts will interview the renovation team and get feedback from them on what they are working on and to a basic degree, how to do some of the projects.

Act 3

The hosts will visit local art and craft stores to gather items that they need to start working on some design projects that they will add to the room to customize it and add finishing touches once the renovation team has painted, carpeted and done all building related work.

Act 4

The hosts will wrap up the show and start to reveal some of the renovations.

Act 5

The show will conclude with the hosts officially revealing the changes to the family and telling the family about the changes while the television audience watches their reaction.

TEEN DREAM ROOM PILOT ON PAPER Written by Melisha Childs

FADE IN:

EXT. FRONT OF A FAMILY HOME - EARLY AFTERNOON - SUMMER

Taniya begins the episode by introducing the family to receive the renovation.

TANIYA

The Smith family has been struggling with how to change their basement into a livable space for their 16 year old son, BRANDON. He has been sharing a small bedroom with his 13 year old brother for the past 10 years and has recently moved into the basement.

The area in the basement is not designed to be a bedroom so the Smith family wants to transform this space into a comfortable bedroom for their son.

INT. A FAMILY HOME

Brandon shows the room to the camera crew.

BRANDON

Me and my brother RICHARD have shared rooms for about 10 years so I was more than ready to get my own room. I love having the basement area as my room because I have more privacy but as you can see, there is nothing special about this space. I've moved my stuff in but it doesn't quite fit what I had in mind.

Brandon points out some problems in the room.

BRANDON

The walls are made of paneling. The cement wall on this side is really horrible; I can't hang any of my posters on these walls. There is some water damage here. This lighting is a nightmare.

Sometimes it takes a few seconds for the light to even come on because it is so old-fashioned. Also, sometimes it gets freezing cold down here even in the summer time. This floor, gets so cold that I almost always have to have socks or shoes on. I can't lounge barefoot.

EXT. A FAMILY HOME

TODD walks up to TANIYA outside and they both introduce the show.

TANIYA & TODD (IN UNISON)

This is where we come in and help Brandon and the Smith family to create a room that "fits" what Brandon has in mind.

Title of the show appears on-screen; "Teen Dream Room" and theme music plays.

INT. INSIDE A FAMILY HOME

TANIYA and 2 walk into the home and introduce themselves to the Smith family. They interview additional family members about the makeover. All are seated and ready to discuss issues with Brandon's room.

KATIE (BRANDON'S MOM)

Me and Mike purchased this home 20 years ago with three bedrooms not anticipating that we would have four kids. So, our kids have had to double up on rooms. A few months ago, Brandon came to me asking if he could move into the basement.

I sympathized with his request because he is the oldest and really wants his privacy and independence. I just didn't know how this space would work for him because the area in the basement is not really a room; it's just an open area.

Our home is over 40 years old and it is not really suitable for a bedroom - but of course Brandon insisted.

MICHAEL (BRANDON'S FATHER)

I tried to help him fix it up down there but renovations have been minor because the area in the basement doesn't have a distinctive area that could be considered a room. We've just had to go with the flow of the space and do the best that we could to make it feel like a bedroom for him.

There is no door so he can hear all the noises in the basement including the furnace, washing machine, and other things. I hung a sliding door down there which gives him some privacy but it isn't the nicest looking entryway.

TANTYA

So Brandon, I've seen the space and I see the challenges that you and your parents are talking about. What do you think you would like to have done to the room?

Brandon speaks and a checklist appears as he and his parents respond to TANIYA's question.

BRANDON

I definitely would like to have the room look more spacious even though it is very tiny. I would also like to have carpet floors. I love video games and I would love to have more space to play the interactive games.

I would also like to have some seating for my friends when they come over and compete. I would love to have a convertible bed - like a fold away couch or something - so that I can use my other video game accessories and not have to constantly move furniture around.

KATIE

And I would like to add that he has an area to study. He has to keep those grades up between video game competitions.

MICHAEL

I just want to add that I especially want the water damage fixed and the paneling removed.

Also, like Brandon said, if you all could open up the room a bit - to make it feel more spacious - that would be great because I plan to convert this into my man cave once he goes away to college. (LAUGHING)

After hosts listen to requests, they cut to a scene in which each host shows two computer generated design ideas.

TODD

So we've heard your complaints about the room and have generated your wish list. We have come up with two designs for you.

TANIYA

In this more affordable design, we work within the existing layout of the room and make minor changes. We patch up the water damage and we cover the floor with carpet. We also create a small study area for you in this corner.

We include a flat screen mounted on the opposite wall of your bed and we purchase a couch bed or something similar so that the bed won't always be visible. We give you some better overhead lighting and seal up any cracks around the window and in the wall to keep out any cold air. We also remove the sliding door and replace it with a real door.

We will finalize it with a fresh coat of paint. All of these changes will cost about \$2000.

TODD

We have also generated a design that is a little more expensive but completely changes the look of the space. In this design we will remove these intrusive walls in order to open up the space. If there are supporting beams behind the wall, which I'm almost sure there are, we will expose them, paint them and decorate them to make them not as noticeable.

This will make the room feel much larger. We also will go outside and determine where the water leak is coming from and patch up the leak from outside in order to keep the water damage from recurring. We will also provide you with a much more environmentally friendly window that will regulate the temperature better than your existing window.

We tear down this paneling, add more insulation, and install new drywall. As in design 1, we carpet the room and replace the lighting. We also build a desk in the corner to serve as a study area. Some of your posters will be framed and placed on the walls throughout the room.

Now here is the major difference between this one and the first design: we will build a wall unit here for your flat screen television that disappears when it is not in use. You will use a remote control or this up and down lever on the wall to make the television go up or down to hide or reveal itself as necessary. (FAMILY REACTS IN AMAZEMENT)

Also, we will build a bench here which will house a fold away bed similar to a couch bed so that you can hide your bed and make this look like a bench so that when your friends come over to compete, you will have much more room. Of course

with this design, we will also provide you with a door.

This design is a bit more expensive - its \$4500 - but it completely transforms the space and makes it suitable to be converted into a man cave for dad when you go away to college. (FAMILY PAUSES TO THINK AND REACT)

TANIYA

Ok, which will it be? Option 1 or Option 2.

Katie is shrugs her shoulders and passes the buck to her husband.

KATIE

I think I will pass this decision to the money man. (CHUCKLES)

MICHAEL

Thanks a lot. Place all the pressure on me! (CHUCKLES) Well, the first one is the more economical solution but since I do want this to eventually become my man cave, I think we want to go with option 2.

TODD

Great choice. We will get started on it right away.

Pre-commercial segment.

NARRATOR

Coming up, the Smith family basement will begin to be transformed from the inside out as Brandon gets the room he has always dreamed of. The crew begins by removing the unsightly paneling and discovering the source of the water leak.

Commercial break - 2 minutes

Post-commercial segment.

NARRATOR

Taniya and Todd and the renovation team begin working to clear out the furniture from the room and tearing down the old paneling. They begin work on the outside of the house fixing the cause of the water leak.

EXT. A FAMILY HOME

TODD

There is a lot of demolition going on inside. While the team is clearing out the inside, I'm going to see what Bob is working on. (WALKING TOWARDS BOB). Hey Bob. How's it going?

BOB

Not too bad. What we have found is that the gutter is damaged here and it is causing the water to pour directly onto the basement of the house. Over time, when it rains, the water is not flushing away from the house as it should and instead is forming large swamps of water that is seeping down into the foundation.

This has caused minor erosion of the cement that created the water damage that you see on the inside of the house. In order to avoid replacing the entire gutter, I have this sealant here that I am going to apply which will allow for the water to funnel away from the house like it is supposed to.

And my buddy TONY is digging a small ditch here. You see these cracks in the base of the wall; these are allowing some water to leak in when it rains. He is also going to use some of this sealant to patch up the holes causing the leak in the basement.

It's really not as bad as I thought it would be because my initial thought was that we would have

to dig a much larger ditch here and work to fortify the foundation by applying more cement. However, it is a simple fix.

TODD

Sweet! Now Brandon doesn't have to worry about seeing any more future water damage right?

BOB

Precisely. This sealant is excellent. They won't have this problem again, ever; one hundred percent sure of it.

TODD

Ok. As Bob and Tony finish patching up things outside, let's go back inside to see what's going on.

INT. A FAMILY HOME

TODD

Big John! What's happening, man?
(ENTHUSIASTICALLY)

JONATHAN

It's all good, man. I'm here examining the wall behind the paneling that was removed earlier. As you can see here and over there on that wall, there are small cracks that formed in the foundation over the years and this is letting in some of the cold air that Brandon is feeling when the weather changes.

TODD

Oh yeah. Bob, just showed me those same cracks. He and Tony just patched them up with a sealant.

JONATHAN

Yes, these are those infamous cracks that were giving us all kinds of problems. I'm also using a slightly different indoor sealant to patch the cracks up from the inside.

You see these cracks here; this is where the paneling was and it is far worse damage here because these were hidden. So I imagine that when its winter here, it's probably freezing because the air is just pouring in through these larger cracks.

TODD

Yeah, Brandon said it's freezing down here even in the summer.

TODD

Yeah, I bet. So I am filling these cracks in and then we can proceed with putting the insulation and drywall up. There will be no more water damage and no more cold air pouring in.

INT. LOCAL HOBBY STORE - LATE AFTERNOON

TANIYA

While the guys are busy repairing the foundation and installing drywall, I decided to get away for a moment and do what I do best - that is look for some things to decorate with. Now, Brandon is a video game fanatic! Much of his stuff is still in his brother's closet and he has a *lot* of stuff.

So I want to first of all get some nice frames to make the room look good. His walls have been pretty bare because of his inability to hang things on the cement and paneling walls. But now that he will have dry wall, I am going to get some nice frames and make a collage of some of his video game posters that he has collected over the years.

TANIYA purchases some nice but cheap frames for her collage project. Her movement throughout the store is sped up on camera.

Other host is at a lumber store with a project team member. They are seeking wood for various furniture projects for the room.

INT. LOCAL LUMBER STORE - LATE AFTERNOON

TODD

While Taniya is away gathering some frames for her project I decided to take a break from the fellows and gather materials for another project. Here are some pieces of wood that we will use to create the study area for Brandon's room.

What I plan to do is create a desk that folds away for more space when not in use. This pine wood seems like a good choice - it is nice and sturdy and easy to cut.

CUT TO TODD back at the Smith family home with the piece of wood. He is working with a project team member on the desk outside in the driveway.

EXT. SMITH FAMILY HOME - EVENING

TODD

Me and DOMINIC are here working on the desk for Brandon's room. I am going to work on cutting the piece down to the dimensions for the space and rounding the corners. I am also going to put a dark stain on it.

Dominic will be creating the metal work that will attach to the bottom of the desk and allow for the desk to sit upwards when in use and fold away when not in use. This will allow for Brandon to do his homework when necessary and fold it away when friends come over. Dominic tell us a little more about what you are working on.

DOMINIC

Well these are some black metal pieces that I picked up. They are very easy to put together. As you can see, all I have to do is click these pieces into place and I'm done!

Once you finish sanding down and staining your pieces of wood, I'm going to drill these into the wood and it will be ready to install.

Camera speeds up their work on the desk project.

TODD

Ok. Now that we are finished with this, let's see how things are coming inside.

INT. NEXT DAY - AFTERNOON

Drywall has been placed inside the basement. TANIYA is inside assisting with painting.

TANIYA

So, here we have a blank slate; a completely white room that I'm going to transform by applying a cool coat of blue. This color will create a cozy atmosphere to make this space feel more roomier.

On this wall here, I'm going to do something a bit unique. I am applying this tape because I'm going to create stripes on the wall.

Usually stripes are created vertically but I'm going to do some large horizontal stripes across this wall where Brandon's bed will be. The other walls will be a solid color.

TODD on the other side of the room speaking to a project team member about the support beams.

TODD

While TANIYA is painting on the opposite side of the room, DAN is here addressing these supporting walls that protrude in the room, taking up some valuable space. He has removed the walls and exposed the beams. Dan what are you planning to do to this supporting beam?

DAN

Well, I thought it would be cool to build a really nice greek-like column here on both sides to make the exposed beams look nicer and to provide balance in the room. As you can see, when we removed these protruding walls, and that made the room look more spacious.

Most of what we removed was old dry-wall and these wood support beams remained. They were actually in really good condition so there was not much for me to do but create these fixtures at the top to create a doric style greek column and now I'm working on shaping the wood around the beam so that it has a smooth concave shape. Once I'm finished I'm going to paint the beams.

Camera speeds up his work.

EXT. DRIVEWAY - LATE AFTERNOON

TANIYA

Ok. While we are waiting for the paint to dry, I thought this would be the perfect time for me to work on my framing project. I have Brandon's mom here with me and she's going to assist me with the framing. You ready, mom?

KATIE

I am! This is so cool.

TANIYA

Yes it is! So, Brandon chose several different posters that he had stored away that he wants me to frame. Ok, mom, we have various frames that I chose for the room and you and I are going to cut some of these posters down to size so that they can fit into the frames. You need this ruler and precision cutter and we can get to work.

KATIE

Ok, great. Sounds easy enough for me!

TANIYA

Here is one completed frame that I worked on already. As you can see it is cut and encased in this flat frame. But I also purchased some shadow box frames for the pieces that you and I will be working on, Katie.

Both of them are cutting out various posters to make a collage.

KATIE

Ok. Am, I doing this right? I'm so nervous.

TANIYA

No need to be nervous. You are doing great. Once we have them all cut out, we are going to mount them into these shadow boxes.

INT. A BASEMENT OF A HOUSE

TODD

Well right now I am here with the crew and we are about to begin to start warming up the room for Brandon. We have already patched up the leaks and installed the insulation and dry wall but now we are going to install this awesome window for Brandon that regulates the temperature, keeping it cool for him in the summer and warm in the winter.

We are also going to lay down some carpet. Here with Jonathan again. What are you working on?

JONATHAN

Well I ordered this window online. It is a high quality window that is particularly designed for basement areas such as these that have temperature regulation troubles. (REMOVES WINDOW FROM THE PACKAGING AND INSTALLS IT)

I am just going to drill it into place and pretty soon, we will feel the difference in temperature in here.

Walks towards STEVE.

TODD

Now Brandon mentioned that his lighting is the pits. Well STEVE is over here working on installing some recessed lighting which will not only provide light but also warmth. This will also help with keeping the temperature stable down here.

STEVE

I'm working on the recessed lighting for the room. At first there was a single light bulb that was suspended from the ceiling. It was an odd arrangement and full of shortages within the wiring. This was causing the light to take a few seconds to cut on when someone turns on the switch.

That could have, by the way, been a potential fire hazard. I got rid of that single light and now I'm installing recessed lighting right across here and over near where the television will be, I'm creating a couple of spotlights.

TODD

So, Steve is finishing up his lighting project and over here, the floor is being carpeted which will be the most critical aspect of warming up this room. Now, Brandon can enjoy being a barefoot bandit while playing with his video game accessories. How's everything coming guys.

CARPETING TEAM (IN UNISON)

Great!

JAMES

We are installing carpet but before we do this, we had to ensure that the floor was free of as much moisture as possible because it is very difficult to maintain carpet in a basement. We removed the linoleum that was down and we resurfaced the floor with a new layer of corrugated polyethylene, a thin sheet of plywood, and a very thin padding.

Katie and Michael's house is very old and there had been no effort to minimize moisture so that too could have been adding to the cold air down here that Brandon often feels. Now that we have completed the sub-floor, we are installing this low-pile carpet which would be great for keeping out moisture and good for high traffic.

TODD

Everything is almost complete in here (ENTHUSIASTICALLY). These guys are working hard to warm up Brandon's room. Jonathan is finished with the window and is now adding the last piece to the puzzle by adding a door and soon the core of this basement reno will be finished.

Pre-commercial segment.

NARRATOR

Coming up, the project team will begin to work on two distinctive features of the room while(insert name of TANIYA) shops for a few more furniture items for the room.

Commercial Break - 2 minutes

Post-commercial segment.

NARRATOR

Todd, Taniya and the project team are working to put the finishing touches on BRANDON's room by building the last two distinctive features of the room and by adding some last minute furniture items in preparation for the reveal.

INT. SMITH FAMILY HOME - NEXT DAY

TODD

BRAD is here working on a very unique project. Brad tell us about what you are doing here.

BRAD

Well what I have done is built this portion of the wall. It is all finished except for the wiring and mounting of the television. A couple of twists here and screws there for the wall mount and voila. Let's try it out.

Brad hands TODD the remote to the hideaway television. Initially it doesn't work.

TODD

Ok, dude, I'm pressing the up and down button and it is not working. Do you have batteries in this thing.

BRAD

My good man, that would probably be the problem. You're a genius.

Brad puts the batteries in the remote and hands it back to TODD. The television stand appears and disappears behind the makeshift wall as he presses the up and down button.

TODD

Sweet!

TODD

TRENT is finishing up the bed project that he has been working on. He has built this fine wood box encasing that he is going to install. Trent tell us more about this project.

TRENT

Well, this box that I have just finished will house the fold-away bed. Right now, I'm mounting the metal frame for the bed.

Trent drills the metal frame into the wall followed by installing the wood box encasing that will hide the bed.

TODD

Cool beans! All finished. Now all we will need is a coat of paint, pillows for this baby, and most importantly, the bed.

INT. LOCAL DISCOUNT FURNITURE STORE

TANIYA

I'm so excited because we are almost finished with Brandon's room. I'm here gathering a few more pieces of furniture for the room to add the finishing touches to prepare for tomorrow's reveal.

TODD

And I am trying to find an adjustable mattress that is comfortable to put on the fold-away bed.

Camera screen is split showing both hosts' sped up movements throughout the store gathering last minute items.

TANIYA

Whew! All finished. Now its time for us to head back to the Smith family home to complete this project.

Pre-commercial segment.

NARRATOR

Coming up Taniya and Todd show Brandon and his family his new room.

Commercial Break - 2 minutes

Post-commercial segment.

NARRATOR

The Smith family is ready to see the changes that the project team has done to the basement. TANIYA and 2 are likewise ready to reveal these improvements.

I'm sorry. We already made plans for this to be my man cave, son. (PATTING SON ON BACK; CHUCKLING)

TODD

KATIE

Oh my gosh. I love how the posters turned out and I absolutely love the study area.

TODD

TANIYA

(Various views display on screen)

It wasn't a livable space and didn't offer much privacy for Brandon. There was not much room for his things, it was very chilly, and there was no door to distinguish this space from the rest of the basement.

TODD

However, now Brandon has a space that is all his own with many unique aspects of the room so that he can wow his friends. With a little attentiveness to the needs of Brandon and his family we have transformed this space from a bland, dusty basement nook into a "Teen Dream Room."
